To All Antique and Classic Boat enthusiasts;

This is an exciting, milestone year for the Finger Lakes Chapter Antique and Classic Boat Show. We're celebrating 30 years in Skaneateles, having established this show on the north end of the lake in 1994. Altogether, this is the chapter's 46th annual show.

This acclaimed event is located in the beautiful, colonial-style village at the north end of Skaneateles Lake, one of the cleanest lakes in the country. The village docks and piers reach 300' toward the south, providing solid mooring with sturdy cleats and built-in fendering. Land displays along the shoreline showcase more boats, motors, themed exhibits, registration, show support, the Ship's Store, kid's activity area and the Chamber of Commerce display. A classic gazebo in the park is where live music is performed on Friday evening and through the weekend.

Trailered boats are launched just two miles south of the village (west side of the lake) at a state facility that is free of charge. Chapter volunteers are on hand, assisting with launching, traffic control and even valet service for your towing vehicle and trailer. In the village, staff will be on hand to help you dock and more volunteers will be at the park to assist with land displays.

This show is always held on the last full weekend of July. This is a judged event (optional) with awards in several categories in accordance with the ACBS two-track judging system. We ask for a \$15.00 donation to defray judge's expenses.

The chapter's history has taken us from state parks to canal-side villages to broad lakes and busy ports. Thirty years ago, we came to Skaneateles and have made this quaint, colonial-style village our boat show home. This historic village was founded in 1833 and boasts excellent restaurants, enticing boutiques and shops. There are handsomely restored and maintained homes on tree-lined streets and alluring lake-side parks. Considerable parking and easy walking polishes the experience of the visit. We have lodging recommendations on page 6 of this invitation. All are convenient and close-by, many are easy walking distance. The <u>Sherwood Inn</u> is right across the street and is where our Friday Night Barbecue and Saturday Evening Award Banquet takes place. We suggest making lodging reservations as early as possible.

It is important to get your registrations in early, as well. Exhibit space will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. This popular show is a high point for exhibitors and public alike. We look forward to this signature summer event when we can enjoy a weekend with our many friends in the antique boating community and offer a taste of what the Finger Lakes region has to offer.

We can't wait to show you what Abraham Lincoln's Secretary of State, William H. Seward meant when he described Skaneateles as the "most beautiful body of water in the world."

Important Notices to Mariners

- Brianna's Law is in effect in New York State. Operators of a certain age must have a Boater Safety Certificate in order to operate a motorized vessel on NYS waters. By 2025, this will include all operators. Certificates issued by the Office of Parks and Recreation, Power Squadron, US Coast Guard Auxiliary and others are acceptable as well as out-of-state certificates. Commercial licenses issued by NYS, other states or the Coast Guard are also recognized. *FLC and ACBS are not liable for any boater not having the proper certification.*
- All in-water exhibitors will be required to open their engine hatches at the launch ramp *prior* to starting their engines. The chapter also notes that ECOS (Emergency Cut--off Switches) are required for boats under 26' in New York State.
- <u>Boat Parade Participants</u> must attend a safety meeting at 2:00 pm on Saturday (July 27). The purpose is to ensure safety, proper order and to allow the dock crew to assist in an orderly manner. The procedures of leaving the dock, the route of the parade, and Sunday's "photo shoot" will be discussed.



ACBS Boat and Motor Classifications

Historic: A boat or motor built up to and including 1918
Antique: A boat or motor built between 1919 and 1942, inclusive
Classic: A boat or motor built between 1943 and 1975, inclusive
Late Classic: A boat built after 1975 through the year 25 years prior to the current year (1976-1999)
Contemporary: Any wooden boat built in the past 25 years.

Judging Categories

The Boat Show is a judged event with awards in the three judging categories shown below (**Preserved Boats**, **Restored Boats** and **Other**). Wooden boats being judged in the Preserved category should be high-scoring boats with at least 60% of the original deck and topside wood remaining. In addition, any restoration work must have been done using the same methods as the original builder. Restored boats are those with less originality. A relatively new award is the "Best in Show, Non-Wood" which may be won by an entry in either the Preserved or Restored category. The judges, using information supplied by the owner and the ACBS Judging Guidelines, will ultimately confirm the proper category for an entry being judged. Marque Club Awards will be awarded to outstanding examples of Century, Chris Craft, Gar Wood, Hacker Craft and Lyman boats as determined by the judges.

<u>A boat may not be awarded the same award two years in row, per FLC tradition and common practice. To win an award, any boat or motor must score 85 or higher.</u>

Judging Fees

The chapter charges \$ 15.00 per exhibitor wishing to have boat(s) or motor(s) judged. This donation will help defray the chapter's costs in expenses of the judge team. This may be paid on the Reservation page (page 7 of this invitation) if you opt to be judged.

Judging Agreement

While boats and motors are being judged, the owners are encouraged to be present.

By registering a boat to be judged, the owner explicitly grants permission for judges to board the boat as may be needed to properly carry out the judging process, even if the owner is not present.

Judges are experienced in such matters and exercise care while examining a boat or motor being judged.

- Completed Registration Forms should be returned with payment no later than <u>July 12</u>. Forms may be emailed, payment should be sent by mail or phoned in. Due to limitations in space, capacity numbers are firm. <u>Registrations will be honored in the order received.</u>
- 2) A history of your boat must be received by <u>May 24</u> (accompanied by completed registration and reservation forms with appropriate payments) in order to be considered for publication in the boat show program. Please include a photo of the boat. A history and inclusion in the program is completely optional.
- 3) Entries received after <u>July 12</u> will be welcomed on a space-available basis. They will, however, be eligible for judging solely at the discretion of the Chief Judge.
- 4) Adjustments to the number of meal reservations (increases or refunds) can be accommodated up to two weeks before the start of the boat show (<u>Friday, July 12</u>).
